The National Early Warning Platform for Emergencies Using the Cell Broadcast Service

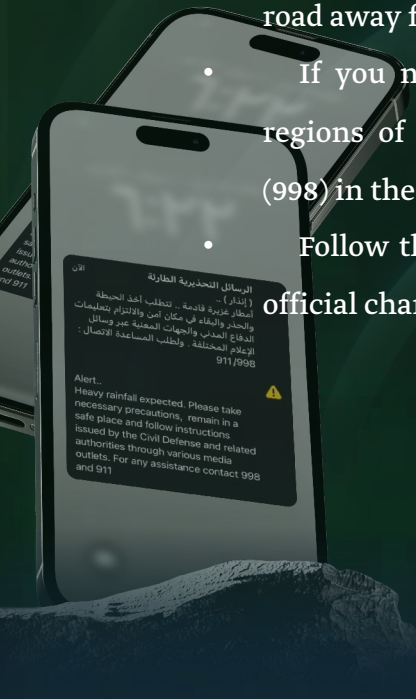


It is one of the early warning systems through which alerts about emergency situations are sent to mobile phones via telecommunications networks. These alerts are accompanied by a distinctive tone and vibration to warn the public and prompt them to take appropriate protective measures.

If You Receive Warning Messages from the National Early Warning Platform for Emergencies

Please follow the instructions below:

- Remain calm and follow official instructions.
- Immediately proceed to the nearest safe place (inside a building or an interior room away from windows) and stay there until the danger has passed.
- Do not leave your home or building until the danger has passed.
- Stay away from open areas, windows and glass, and do not stand on balconies or roofs.
- If you are outdoors, enter the nearest building or take shelter behind a solid barrier.
- Avoid crowds or going to dangerous areas, and refrain from taking photos.
- If you hear warning sirens while driving, pull over to the side of the road away from bridges and high-rise buildings.
- If you notice any danger, call the emergency number (911) in the regions of Makkah, Madinah, Riyadh, and the Eastern Province, and (998) in the rest of the Kingdom.
- Follow the instructions issued by the competent authorities through official channels.



Warning Siren Tones and Their Meanings

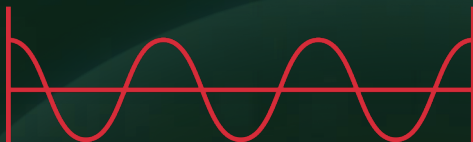
First Tone

Imminent Danger, a steady interrupted tone lasting 60 seconds.



Second Tone

Danger Occurring, a wavy tone lasting 60 seconds.



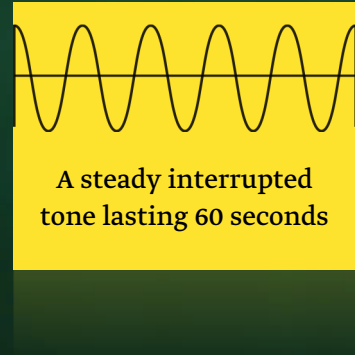
Third Tone

Danger Has Passed, a continuous tone lasting 60 seconds.



If You Hear the Siren

Indicating Imminent Danger

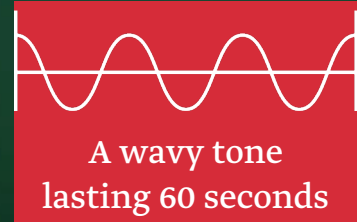


- Remain calm and follow official instructions.
- Immediately proceed to the nearest safe place (inside a building or an interior room away from windows) and stay there until the danger has passed.
- Stay away from open areas, windows and glass, and do not stand on balconies or roofs.
- If you are outdoors, enter the nearest building or take shelter behind a solid barrier.
- Do not leave until you hear the siren indicating Danger Has Passed.
- If you notice any danger, call the emergency number (911) in the regions of Makkah, Madinah, Riyadh, and the Eastern Province, and (998) in the rest of the Kingdom.
- Follow the instructions issued by the competent authorities through official channels.

Indicating Danger Occurring

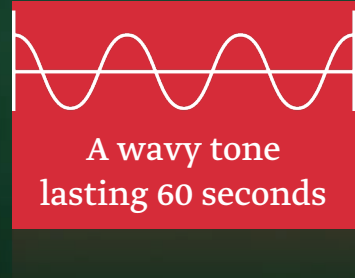


If You Are Inside a House or Building

- Remain calm and follow official instructions.
- Do not leave your home or building unless absolutely necessary until the danger has passed.
- Stay away from open areas, windows and glass, and do not stand on balconies or roofs.
- Leave and evacuate the house or building to the nearest safe place if it becomes clear that remaining inside is dangerous.
- Follow the instructions if evacuation is requested by Civil Defense.
- If you notice any danger, call the emergency number (911) in the regions of Makkah, Madinah, Riyadh, and the Eastern Province, and (998) in the rest of the Kingdom.
- Follow the instructions issued by the competent authorities through official channels.

If You Are Outside the Home or in an Open Area

- **Remain calm and follow official instructions.**
- **Immediately proceed to the nearest safe place (inside a building or an interior room away from windows) and stay there until the danger has passed.**
- **Stay away from open areas, windows and glass, and do not stand on balconies or roofs.**
- **Enter the nearest building or take shelter behind a solid barrier.**
- **Avoid crowds or going to dangerous areas, and refrain from taking photos.**
- **If you hear warning sirens while driving, pull over to the side of the road away from bridges and high-rise buildings.**
- **If you notice any danger, call the emergency number (911) in the regions of Makkah, Madinah, Riyadh, and the Eastern Province, and (998) in the rest of the Kingdom.**
- **Follow the instructions issued by the competent authorities through official channels.**



If You Hear the Siren Indicating Danger Has Passed

A continuous tone
lasting 60 seconds

- Remain calm and follow official instructions.
- Do not leave homes or buildings until it is fully confirmed that the danger has completely passed.
- Refrain from taking photos.
- Avoid crowds and stay away from dangerous areas.
- Provide assistance to others while ensuring that you do not put yourself at risk.
- If you notice any danger, call the emergency number (911) in the regions of Makkah, Madinah, Riyadh, and the Eastern Province, and (998) in the rest of the Kingdom.
- Follow the instructions issued by the competent authorities through official channels.
